The new project will be "a level above in details and finishes," Martin said. "I think you'll see that."

Martin also feels the new building will have a great location.

"A lot of people don't realize that the access and egress is exceptional," Martin said. "There are three different ways to get to the beltway from the location."

Granite has had some discussions with potential tenants and has some proposals out. though there are no definitive commitments yet.

"But we decided to move forward because the opportunity is right," Martin said.

As of November, Granite's project was one of 10 proposed developments in west Houston designed to meet a growing demand for Class A office space. In addition to its location in Houston and its headquarters in Dallas, Granite also has locations in Atlanta, Denver and Los Angeles.
